

Travel Dilemma Scenario Cards – Read, Discuss, Act It Out!

Instructions:

1. Read your dilemma card together.
2. Talk about the discussion questions as a group.
3. Be ready to share your ideas with the class and act out a short role play showing how to be a safe friend with a respectful response.

1. A younger child is alone near the school and looks upset.

- 🗨️ How can you show kindness and help them feel safe?
- 🗨️ Who could you tell or ask for help?
- 🧑🏫 **Act It Out:** Use a calm, caring voice and show how you can stay nearby while asking a trusted adult for help.



2. Your friend wants to race across the road before the lights change.

- 🗨️ What can you say to keep your friend safe?
- 🗨️ How can you tell your friend you don't feel safe?
- 🧑🏫 **Act It Out:** Show how you can use a confident voice and make a safe choice.



3. A group of kids are teasing another student while waiting to cross at the lights.

- 🗨️ What could you say or do to help in a safe way?
- 🗨️ Who could you talk to if you see someone being teased?
- 🧑🏫 **Act It Out:** Show how you can stand up for kindness and include others.



4. Your friend drops their hat or drink bottle onto the road and wants to grab it quickly as a bus is coming.

- 🗨️ What's the safest thing to do?
- 🗨️ How can you help them make a safe choice?
- 🧑🏫 **Act It Out:** Show how you stop, look, listen, think and wait until the road is clear of vehicles.



5. A neighbour you don't know very well offers you and a friend you a lift home.

- 🗨️ What should you say or do to keep you both safe?
- 🗨️ How can you get home safely instead?
- 🧑🏫 **Act It Out:** Show how to politely say "no" and call a trusted adult.



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6. Your friends cross the road when the signal is red and tell you to come too.

- What can you say to be a safe friend?
- How can you stand up for what's safe?
- Act It Out:** Show how you can wait, even if your friends don't.



7. Someone you don't know starts asking you and your friend personal questions at the bus stop.

- How can you use your voice to protect yourself and your friend?
- When should you walk away or tell an adult?
- Act It Out:** Show how to answer safely and seek help from a trusted adult.



8. You see a younger child walking alone and looking unsure where to go.

- How can you help them feel safe?
- What's the best way to get help for them?
- Act It Out:** Show how you find a safe adult, like a teacher or crossing supervisor.



9. Your friend is riding next to you on a shared path and isn't leaving space for you and others.

- What could you say to remind them to share the path safely?
- How can you show respect for others using the path?
- Act It Out:** Show how to move to single file and share the path politely.



10. Your friend is distracted by their phone and doesn't see a car backing out of a driveway.

- What could you do to protect your friend?
- How can you remind them to stay alert while walking?
- Act It Out:** Show how to warn your friend and move to a safe spot.
