

Picture Card Scenarios and Suggestions

1. Headphones

Picture: Headphones lying on a table

Scenario: You're walking to school with headphones on. Someone you don't know taps you on the shoulder from behind.

What would you do? Take off your headphones and step into a safer space.

What could you say? "Please don't come up behind me. What do you need?"

2. Crowded Bus

Picture: A Bus

Scenario: The bus is crowded and a peer keeps insisting you give up your seat even though you're not in a priority seat.

What would you do? Stay seated if appropriate and look for the driver if needed.

What could you say? "I'm staying here. If you need help, talk to the driver."

3. Pedestrian Crossing Button

Picture: A traffic light pedestrian crossing button

Scenario: You're waiting to cross the road and friends keep pushing the traffic button repeatedly even though the light is already on.

What would you do? Keep your hands to yourself and stay waiting safely.

What could you say? "It's already lit. We only need to press it once."

4. Busy Car Park

Picture: Cars in a car park

Scenario: You're riding your bike and a friend suggests taking a shortcut through a busy car park.

What would you do? Stop and take the safe route.

What could you say? "I'm sticking to the proper path — the car park isn't safe."

5. Skateboard Trick

Picture: A skateboard on footpath

Scenario: A friend on a skateboard speeds ahead and urges you to cross the road between parked cars instead of waiting for the crossing.

What would you do? Wait at the crossing.

What could you say? "I'll meet you at the crossing — this way isn't safe."

6. Blocked Path

Picture: A scooter leaning on a wall

Scenario: You're riding your scooter home and a group of older kids block part of the path, teasing you as you approach.

What would you do? Slow down, give space, and go around safely.

What could you say? "Excuse me, I need to get past please."

7. Bus Stop Sign

Picture: A bus stop

Scenario: At the bus stop, another student starts pushing younger students to get a better spot in the line.

What would you do? Step out of the pushing area.

What could you say? "Let's line up properly. It's safer for everyone."

8. Train Doors

Picture: Inside a Train

Scenario: Your friend tries to squeeze onto a train as the doors are closing and tells you to follow quickly.

What would you do? Wait for the next train.

What could you say? "I'm waiting. It's not safe to squeeze in."

9. Backpack

Picture: Walking with a school backpack

Scenario: You're walking with a heavy school bag and someone you don't know asks if they can help you carry your bag.

What would you do? Hold your bag and move away.

What could you say? "No thanks, I'm not comfortable with that."

10. Path Closed

Picture: Detour sign

Scenario: The footpath is partly closed. Friends encourage you to walk on the road instead of using the detour.

What would you do? Follow the signed detour path.

What could you say? "I'm using the detour — the road isn't safe."

11. Bike Locked to Rack

Picture: Bikes on a school bike rack

Scenario: A peer jokes about unlocking someone else's bike "for fun" and tells you to keep lookout.

What would you do? Move away and don't take part.

What could you say? "I'm not doing that. It's not our bike."

12. Mobile Phone

Picture: A phone in someone's hand

Scenario: You're checking your phone and someone you don't know approaches asking to "borrow your phone quickly.

What would you do? Keep your phone and walk towards others.

What could you say? "I can't give you my phone. You can ask an adult again inside."

13. Raining Road

Picture: Cars on a wet road

Scenario: It's raining and visibility is low. Your friend wants to run across the road instead of waiting for a safe moment.

What would you do? Wait until it's safe.

What could you say? "I'm waiting — drivers can't see well in the rain."

14. School Crossing Flags

Picture: Crossing Flags

Scenario: Your peers are chatting and are about to step onto the road before the crossing supervisor gives the signal.

What would you do? Stay behind the line.

What could you say? "I'm waiting for the supervisor's signal."

15. Bike Path Sign

Picture: Shared bike path sign

Scenario: You're riding on a shared path and someone on a fast e-scooter races up behind you, yelling at you to move faster.

What would you do? Ride steadily and move left if safe.

What could you say? "I'm moving over — go ahead."

16. Close to Kerb

Picture: Truck

Scenario: You notice a younger student standing really close to the kerb and a truck is turning and is getting very close.

What would you do? Move towards the student or get the driver's attention.

What could you say? "Stop — that's not okay." or "Driver, someone needs help."

17. Train Station Platform

Picture: Platform safety line

Scenario: Friends are messing around near the yellow safety line on a train station and encouraging you to join in.

What would you do? Stand back safely.

What could you say? "I'm staying behind the line — it's dangerous."

18. Driver Wave

Picture: A car driver

Scenario: A driver waves you across, but you can see another car coming fast from the other direction.

What would you do? Wait until all cars have stopped.

What could you say? "I'm waiting — that car isn't slowing."

19. Lost Dog

Picture: A dog

Scenario: You're walking home and someone you don't know asks you to follow them to help find their lost dog.

What would you do? Move toward other people or a safe place.

What could you say? "I can't go with you. You need to ask an adult."

20. Skate Board Trick

Picture: A skate boarder

Scenario: A friend dares you to try a trick you don't feel confident doing as you skate along the footpath.

What would you do? Choose a safer activity or take a break.

What could you say? "I'm not ready for that trick."

21. School Gates

Picture: Leaving through school gates

Scenario: While leaving school, someone tells you to get into a car with a person you don't know, saying "It's fine, they know your family."

What would you do? Move back toward the school buildings or staff.

What could you say? "I'm not going with someone I don't know."

22. A Banana

Picture: A banana

Scenario: You noticed someone dropped a piece of fruit and it's rolled into the aisle where people could trip.

What would you do? Pick it up or tell the driver.

What could you say? "Someone dropped this — people might trip."

23. Flat Bike Tyre

Picture: Flat bike tyre

Scenario: Your friend gets a flat tyre and wants to ride on the rim the whole way home even though it's unsafe.

What would you do? Stop and walk the bikes.

What could you say? "That'll wreck your wheel. Let's walk or fix it."

24. Lost Property Box

Picture: A school lost-property box

Scenario: A peer picks up a lost item, laughs, and says they're going to keep it. They ask if you want something too.

What would you do? Encourage returning the item.

What could you say? "That belongs to someone. Let's put it back."
