Promoting Safe Walking & Cycling



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50 minutes

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SUBJECT Health & Physical Education, English

RESOURCE OVERVIEW

Walking and cycling are key ways to travel sustainably while keeping active and fit. It's important that children and their families are encouraged to walk and cycle whenever they can, rather than travel by car. However, it's essential that children understand how to be safe as both a pedestrian and cyclist.

In this lesson, students research an organisation that promotes safe walking or cycling and discuss the strategies that the organisation uses.

Lesson Plan

Tuning in

Inform students they will be researching an organisation that promotes cycling or pedestrian safety and looking into the strategies they use.

Ask students to form pairs and discuss the following questions:

- Why do we need to promote safe walking and cycling?
- What do you think are some of the most important safety issues for cyclists and pedestrians?
- Ask some pairs to share ideas they discussed.

Main activity: Assertive communication

In small groups, students should choose a website from an organisation that promotes safety for pedestrians or cyclists.

Students complete their research using the Researching an organisation worksheet.

Extension: students choose a safety issue for pedestrians or cyclists and create a poster or website design to promote safety.

Reflecting activity

Have students share their findings with the class. Use the following questions to guide the discussion.

- What are some similarities and differences between the organisations?
- What strategies do the organisations use to promote safe walking and cycling?
- How would you promote safe walking and cycling?
- Why do we need to promote safe walking and cycling?

Researching An Organisation

Name of organisation: What are the aims of the organisation? How does the organisation raise money? What safety issues does the organisation focus on? What strategies does the organisation use to promote their causes? E.g, Special events, information, talking to the media, writing to politicians

Researching An Organisation (cont..)

What text features are used on the website? E.g., Headings, captions, photos, maps, charts, graphs, diagrams, videos, interactive features

Is the organisation successful in their aims? What evidence is there to show this?
